REMARKS

On 10/2/16 at 2126 hours, I, Officer Remotti, responded to 562 Main Street apartment 2 for suspicious activity where it was determined Dawn Olsen, was observed running from a neighbors door, after attempting to gain entry into their apartment and removed several of a young child's Halloween decorations from the door, tore them up, and threw them down the hallway. The total value was approximately \$10. In a sworn statement from the victim, it is said that she has had numerous issues with Olsen which occur almost daily and involve her being highly intoxicated, confrontational, and very disruptive in the building. stated she concerned over Olsen's increasingly unprovoked, unstable behavior and wished to press charges for her actions.

After completing the summons, I was explaining the details to Olsen when she became irate, screaming "just give me the fucking ticket I am sick of you and don't want to listen to your shit anymore" as she lunged to grab my pen from my left shirt pocket. I grabbed Olsen's hand removing it from my shirt and yelled for her

to step back and not approach an officer in such a manor. Olsen then turned away and tried to close her door in my face, as she walked away. Because the summons was not issued, I requested Olsen step back into the doorway as I gently grabbed her right arm in an effort to guide her back to the door, however, Olsen pushed me away in an attempt to escape my custody. I then increased my grip on Olsen's right arm and pulled out into the hallway to conclude the issuance of the summons.

Based on the above facts and circumstance, Olsen was issued Misdemeanor Summons and Complaint # MC397204, charging her with Criminal Mischief 3rd Degree; 53a-117, and Interfering with an Officer; 53a-167a in violation of C.G.S. A G.A.-9 court appearance date of 10/18/16 was issued to her.

No further police action was taken at this time.

REMARKS

On Tuesday 10-04-2016 at approximately 2235 hours I, Det. Lathrop was traveling E/B on Wadsworth Street near the intersection of Wadsworth Street and Long Lane in an unmarked Police Vehicle. I observed a white BMW traveling S/B on Long Lane just as we both approached the intersection. The intersection of Long Lane and Wadsworth Street is controlled by a stop sign in all directions. The BMW didn't stop for the stop sign at the intersection and preceded S/B on Long Lane. I made a right turn onto Long Lane and followed the white BMW S/B on Long Lane.

I ran the above vehicles CT registration marker (X968C Dealer Plate) through MPD dispatch and I was advised the registration was owned by Mauro Motors out of North Haven CT. I advised MPD dispatch the vehicle description related to the CT dealer registration, a white 2016 BMX328i. I activated my emergency lights and siren and initiated a motor vehicle stop of the above vehicle for the stop sign violation.

The vehicle came to a stop in front of 479 Long Lane. I approached the vehicle and identified the operator as Viraj K. Ansoliya from his CT operator's license. MPD dispatch advised Ansoliya's operators license was suspended. Ansoliya provided proof of insurance and a valid CT registration.


Ansoliya stated he did not know why his license was suspended. I called MPD dispatch to verify that it was not a DMV error and his license was in fact suspended. MPD dispatch checked the number again and it came back again as suspended. I asked Ansoliya why he went through the stop sign and he stated he thought that he stopped. I explained to Ansoliya that I had observed him drive right through the intersection and he then admitted that he had because he was in a hurry and no cars were around.

I issued Ansoliya Misdemeanor Summons #MC378292 in violation of C.G.S.14-215 Operating under Suspension and 14-301 Stop sign violation. Ansoliya was issued a court date of 10-19-2016 at GA-09 which is located at 1 Court Street Middletown CT 06457 at 09:00 hours.

Ansoliya's vehicle was towed from the scene.

REMARKS

On the above date and time, this officer was on patrol in a marked Middletown Police Cruiser in the area of Washington St. and Bernie O'rourke Dr. in Middletown, Ct. This officer received notification from central dispatch of an anonymous call reporting erratic operation of a White Chevrolet SUV. According to central dispatch, the white Chevrolet SUV was traveling west on Washington St. (RTE 66) and was all over the road swerving between lanes and at one point hitting a curb on the north side of the street. The vehicle was said to have CT Registration 491ZJL.

This officer positioned his cruiser at the west end of Bernie O'Rourke Drive, giving me a clean line of sight up Washington St. This officer pulled out directly behind the white SUV bearing Ct. Reg. 491ZJL as it passed by Bernie O'Rourke Drive traveling west. This officer watched as the SUV came to an abrupt stop at the prescribed traffic control light directly in front of my position. When the light turned green allowing west bound traffic to flow again, this officer got directly behind the SUV in the left hand lane and initiated a motor

vehicle stop. As the SUV bearing Ct Reg. 491ZJL pulled over to the right lane and off the road, the operator did not use a turn signal as it crossed over the lane and subsequently hit a curb, hopping the side walk, bringing the vehicle to a stopped halfway on the sidewalk and the grass.

This officer requested the vehicle information from Central Dispatch at which point it came back as registered to Vanepps Construction out of Westbrook CT. Upon initial approach to the vehicle on the drivers side, this officer could smell the odor of an alcoholic beverage approx. 5 feet prior to the opened drivers side window of the vehicle. This officer made contact with the operator who was identified through his CT DL #167785041 as Thomas Vanepps. Vanepps had bloodshot glossy eyes and this officer could smell a clear and distinct odor of an alcoholic beverage as Vanepps answered basic questions such as where he was headed to and where he was coming from. This officer asked Vanepps if he had consumed any alcoholic beverages whereas Vanepps stated that he had not and that he had been drinking "mucinex" because he was sick.

This officer requested that Vanepps step out of his vehicle so Standardized Field Sobriety Testing could be conducted in order to determine if Vanepps had an elevated blood alcohol level. Vanepps stepped out of the vehicle where he was escorted to the rear of the vehicle and onto the sidewalk so that testing could be conducted on a flat surface away from any traffic hazards. This officer asked Vanepps if he had any medical conditions that would prevent him from further testing. Vanepps stated that he did not. Vanepps also did not wear contacts, glasses or any headgear at time of testing. This officer confirmed that there were no further objects or debris on the road that could have inhibited testing.

Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus

This officer explained the instructions to the Horizontal Gaze Nystagmus (HGN) to Vanepps. Vanepps stated that he understood. During testing, Vanepps swayed back and fourth as he attempted to focus on the stimulus. Vanepps had a lack of smooth, distinct and sustained nystagmus at maximum deviation and on-set of nystagmus prior to 45 degrees.

Walk-Turn

This officer explained the instruction to the Walk-Turn test to Vanepps. While this officer explained the instructions Vanepps was very uneasy on his feet and looked blankly past this officer off into the distance. Vanepps stated that due to bad ankles, he could not conduct said test. This officer notes that Vanepps was asked prior to testing if he had any medical conditions. The Walk-Turn test was considered a refusal.

One Leg Stand

This officer explained the instructions to the one leg stand to Vanepps. Vanepps stated that he understood the instructions, however, during the demonstration phase Vanepps had his hands in his pockets with his feet spread apart despite given instructions to keep hands at his sides with his feet together. When Vanepps was told to begin testing, Vanepps put his arms out to balance himself, lifted his right foot, counted to three and placed his right foot back on the ground in order to catch his balance. Vanepps then shrugged and stated he was not going to continue. Again, Vanepps blamed his demeanor on the fact he was taking "mucinex".

Vanepps was placed under arrest for being in violation of C.G.S. 14-227a Operating Under the Influence of Drugs and or Alcohol. Vanepps was taken to Middletown Police Headquarters where further testing and booking could be conducted.

Vanepps was read his Notice of Rights and the A-44 Implied consent where he was given the opportunity to contact an attorney at 2204 hrs. Vanepps waived his right to an attorney and further testing continued.

During the question process of the A-44. Vanepps stated that he had drank Titos vodka at approx 1330 hrs but that he only two drinks.

This officer chose the Breath Testing. The breath testing was conducted using the Drager Alcotest to which this office is trained and certified to use.

Test #1 was conducted at 2218 hrs and showed Vanepps to have an elevated blood alcohol content of .1946

Test #2 was conducted at 2239 hrs and showed Vanepps to have an elevated blood alcohol content of .1852


Vanepps was issued an M.S.C. #MC455102 and Charged with being in violation of C.G.S. 14-236 Failure to Maintain Lane and 14-227a Operating Under the influence of Drugs and or Alcohol.

Vanepps was released on a \$500.00 non-surety bond where he was given a court date of October 24, 2016 GA 9. 1 Court St. Middletown, Ct.

Vanepps was given a copy of all paperwork and released to a sober party (



REMARKS

At approximately 2045 hours Detective Lemieux and I were conducting surveillance in the south parking lot of Maplewood Terrace. We observed male exit a white Nissan Maxima bearing Connecticut registration AE95760 in the south parking lot of Maplewood Terrace. I was able to identify the male as Salvatore Pizzuto from prior search and seizure warrant for selling marijuana and I have personally arrested Pizzuto in the past for possession of crack cocaine and marijuana with intent to sell. We observed with a clear and unobstructed view as Pizzuto met with an unidentified black male. They engaged in a hand to hand transaction in which Pizzuto handed the black male an item and in return the male handed Pizzuto something. We believed through our training and experience that we observed a suspected drug transaction.

Pizzuto got into the Nissan and began to drive away. We lost sight of the unidentified male. We followed Pizzuto as he made another stop on East Main Street by Elm Street. We were not in a position to see what Pizzuto was doing or if he was meeting with anyone else. The vehicle then pulled away from the parking space and proceeded to the intersection of East Main Street and Main Street Extension. Pizzuto failed to signal when he made a right turn onto Main Street Extension. I activated our emergency lights and siren and initiated a traffic stop on East Main Street by Russell Street.

The vehicle was occupied by Pizzuto and a female. As we approached the vehicle I observed Pizzuto remove a baggie of marijuana from his right sweatshirt pocket and place into the center console of the vehicle. As Pizzuto opened the window I could immediately detect the distinct odor of marijuana emanating from the vehicle. I was able to identify the odor through my training and experience. I had Pizzuto exit the vehicle and he complied. I searched Pizzuto and in his right sweatshirt pocket I found a sandwich baggie of suspected marijuana. Pizzuto also had \$200 in US currency in his right sweatshirt pocket and \$40 in his wallet.

I had female exit the vehicle and searched it. In the center console I found two baggies of suspected marijuana. I also found a small empty plastic container commonly used to package illicit drugs. The center console also contained numerous US currency wrappers with the amounts \$1000 and \$800 written on them. I know through my training and experience that drug dealers will often utilize these bands to organize their money as their transactions are made in cash. There were two prescription bottles made out to Pizzuto from the Arrow Alternative Care marijuana dispensary. The bottles were empty and were for 2.1 grams and 3.5 grams respectively. There was \$60 in US currency and two cellular phones in the center console as well and three partially burnt suspected marijuana cigarettes. There was another cellular phone by the gear shifter of the vehicle.

A female Connecticut Valley Hospital Police Officer came to the scene and searched) .. She was free of any contraband and released at the scene.

The bag marijuana in Pizzuto's pocket weighed 28.6 grams. The baggies of marijuana in the center console weighed 14.9 grams and 6.6 grams respectively. The total amount of marijuana found was 50.1 grams (1.76 ounces). The suspected marijuana tested positive for the presumptive presence of marijuana with NARK 9.

A check of the Connecticut Prescription Monitoring Data Base revealed that Pizzuto purchased marijuana legally from a licensed dispensary 5 times since he was issued his marijuana card in December of 2015(see attached printout from the website). Since Pizzuto was issued his marijuana card he only purchased 23.1 grams and a marijuana brownie, far less than the amount that he was found with in the vehicle during the stop.



It was clear that Pizzuto did not purchase the marijuana through the proper legal channels. The amount marijuana in Pizzuto's possession was far more than a user could possibly consume in any sitting. The amount of marijuana that he was carrying was an amount an individual would be transporting in a motor vehicle to make a sale of the drug. None of the marijuana was stored in the proper prescription container and was rather packaged in individual bags for sale. Pizzuto also had the US currency bands with large amounts written on them, indicative of an individual involved in a cash business, such as drug sales. Given Pizzuto's extensive history of drug arrests, coupled with the above stated facts, it was evident that Pizzuto was directly involved in the sale of marijuana.

Pizzuto was transported to the Middletown Police Department where he was fingerprinted, photographed, and processed. Pizzuto waived his Miranda rights. Pizzuto claimed that he does not sell marijuana and that he needs "a lot of weed" to get high. He said that he buys all of his marijuana legally from a dispensary.

The \$300 in US currency and cellular phones were deemed the ill-gotten gains of drug sales and seized under asset forfeiture. The Nissan was transported back to the Middletown Police Department. The owner, , was contacted and given an innocent owners letter stating if Pizzuto was found in any of her vehicles again with illegal drugs it was subject to seizure.

Pizzuto was held on a \$150,000 surety bond for violation of CGS 21a-279(a)(1) Possession of a Controlled Substance and 21a-277(b) Possession of Marijuana with Intent to Sell. He is scheduled to appear at GA9 in Middletown on 10/14/2016 at 0900 hours.

Pizzuto has 2 pending cases at GA9 in Middletown where he is out on an \$8000 cash bond for possession of drug paraphernalia, risk of injury to a minor, forgery 1st, possession of a controlled substance, possession of marijuana with intent to sell, possession of narcotics with intent to sell, and possession of narcotics. He has prior convictions for interfering with a police officer and assault 3rd.
